Pagosa Spring's Second Annual "Bloody Mary Showdown" is a tasting of Bloody Marys to be provided by local contestants (businesses and individuals) at Yamaguchi Park on Saturday, July 24th beginning at 9:00 a.m. and continuing until the start of the Cruise-a-Thong around 11:00 a.m. Contestants are responsible for providing their signature Bloody Mary mix; the event coordinators will provide one 750 ml bottle of Vodka to each competitor, per State of Colorado liquor laws. Both a "Professional" and "Amateur" winner will be chosen by a "People's Choice" taste testing and the winners will receive tasteful awards for their achievements in mixology. Competitors will be assigned an area from which to serve and are encouraged to make this area unique and provide signage from their restaurant (if professional). Tasters will be charged \$10 for unlimited (within reason) tasting/judging of the prepared Bloody Marys. We estimate the event will have at least 50 "tasters;" we anticipate this would equate to between one and two gallons of mix to provide for the tasting.
